RE: District Fringe Festival

The OANC has received a copy of a grant request from Nu Sass Productions for the District Fringe Festival. I have reviewed the application and supplemental material sent to the OANC and have found that the request contains **permissible** expenditures of ANC monies as outlined below. The budget as filed requested both permissible and impermissible expenses. A list of permissible expenses is at the end of this memo which exceeds the grant request. I have included so that the Applicant and ANC know what receipts will be needed.

There are five prongs a grant must meet to be a permissible expense 1 and a 6th requirement of the D.C. Official Code that limits the amount of a grant that can be spent on overhead 2. They are:

- 1. **Public Purpose:** ANC grants must be for "public purposes within the Commission area." A public purpose is one "that includes a significant benefit for the community and is not done for the primary purpose of benefitting a private entity." Initially the OANC was concerned that the District Fringe has been known as an area wide festival for the DMV. The applicant sent a follow up email that this is the "new" Fringe Festival and there will sufficiently focus on the residents and businesses of ANC 3F that it will provide a significant benefit to ANC 3F.
- 2. **Local Benefit**: A grant must "benefit persons who work or reside in the Commission area." This does not mean the grant may only benefit Commission residents; it simply

means the grant's benefits should be focused on those residents.⁶ Again, based upon the communications with the applicant the OANC is satisfied that this event will have a sufficient focus on the businesses and residents of ANC 3F that a local benefit will occur.

- 3. **Proposed Project.** A grant must be for a proposed project. This is a discrete single event.
- 4. **Organization.** A grant must be to an "organization," not an individual or a government entity, 8 although the organization need not be incorporated. 9 Nu Sass Productions **is** an organization within the meaning of the code. The OANC verified the 501(c)(3) status and that it is in good standing with a TEOS on the IRS website.
- **5. Non-Duplication.** A grant cannot duplicate any services offered by the D.C. government. ¹⁰ Sadly, DC does not provide this type of event.
- **6. Overhead.** Overhead cannot exceed 15% of the grant amount. None of the grant monies will be used for overhead as the Code defines it. There is one item that could be used, the insurance, and the limit would be \$1,500.00. There are other non-overhead items that meet the threshold of the grant request that this would not be necessary.

Conclusion

For the reasons stated above this grant is a **permissible** expenditure of ANC funds.

Permissible Expenses

Venue rental \$5,544.00

Advertising (encouraging people to attend our festival in ANC 3F) \$3,000.00 Printing (signage drawing awareness to the festival in ANC 3F) \$5,000.00 Postage and Delivery (fees for delivery of physical collateral) \$500.00 Postage and Content (digital advertising on social media and media advertising one

Digital Content (digital advertising on social media and media advertising encouraging the community to attend the festival in ANC 3F): \$1,200.00 Utilities \$300 (if there can be a specific receipt or if added to venue rental and on that receipt)

The liability insurance for this event only is permissible so long as it does not exceed 15% of the grant or \$1500.00 but is not necessary as the above expenses are more than the grant request.

Costs for purchase of equipment or year-long licenses are not permissible as they inure to the organization. ABCA fees are not permissible.
