## **MEMORANDUM**

RE: Glover Park Citizens Association Grant Request

The OANC has received a copy of a grant request to ANC 3B from the Glover Park Citizens Association for funding for Glover Park Day 2024. The Association plans to use the money for the rental of tables, chairs, and a stage. I have reviewed the grant and found it to be a permissible use of ANC monies should the ANC decide to fund it.

There are five prongs a grant must meet to be a permissible expense 1 and a 6<sup>th</sup> requirement of the D.C. Official Code that limits the amount of a grant that can be spent on overhead 2. They are:

- 1. **Public Purpose:** ANC grants must be for "public purposes within the Commission area." A public purpose is one "that benefits the community as a whole and is not done for the primary purpose of benefitting a private entity." Glover Park day is a community event open to all residents and businesses in the ANC 3B and meets the Public Purpose test.
- 2. **Local Benefit**: A grant must "benefit persons who work or reside in the Commission area." This does not mean the grant may only benefit Commission residents; it simply means the grant's benefits should be focused on those residents. The primary beneficiary of Glover Park day are the residents and businesses in Glover Park.

- 3. **Proposed Project.** A grant must be for a proposed project. This grant is for a one-day discrete event and qualifies as a project as defined by the D.C. Official Code and OAG interpretations of the Code.
- **4. Organization.** A grant must be to an "organization," not an individual or a government entity, 8 although the organization need not be incorporated. 9 The Glover Park Citizens Association is an organization as defined by the D.C. Official Code.
- **5. Non-Duplication.** A grant cannot duplicate any services offered by the D.C. government. <sup>10</sup> The D.C. government does not offer a service like this. There is no similar event offered by the D.C. Government
- **6. Overhead.** Overhead cannot exceed 15% of the grant amount. 11 100% of this grant goes for operational expenses not overhead.

ANCs are prohibited from direct expenditures for entertainment which the stage could potentially be. However, this prohibition does not apply to expenditures by grantees. <sup>12</sup>

## **Conclusion**

For the reasons stated above this grant is a permissible expenditure of ANC funds should the ANC choose to support it.
