RE: Palisades Community Association Grant Request

The OANC has received a copy of a grant request from the Palisades Community Association for spreading chips on the Palisades Trolley Trail. I have reviewed the application sent to the OANC and have found that the request is a **permissible** expenditure of ANC monies as outlined below. The applicant has provided an estimate of costs, not an exact number. Should the receipts not amount to the full amount of the grant, and excess must be returned to the ANC. Should it be an underestimate, the applicant would not be able to return to the ANC as the law prohibits retroactive funding.

There are five prongs a grant must meet to be a permissible expense 1 and a 6th requirement of the D.C. Official Code that limits the amount of a grant that can be spent on overhead 2. They are:

- 1. **Public Purpose:** ANC grants must be for "public purposes within the Commission area." A public purpose is one "that includes a significant benefit for the community and is not done for the primary purpose of benefitting a private entity." The trail is a community resources. Maintenance and improvement of the trail provides a benefit to the 3D community.
- 2. **Local Benefit**: A grant must "benefit persons who work or reside in the Commission area." This does not mean the grant may only benefit Commission residents; it simply

means the grant's benefits should be focused on those residents.⁶ This particular trail runs through ANC 3D and is most easily accessed by the residents of 3D. The residents of 3D are the direct recipients of the benefits of trail improvement.

- 3. **Proposed Project.** A grant must be for a proposed project. This is a discrete single event.
- 4. **Organization.** A grant must be to an "organization," not an individual or a government entity, 8 although the organization need not be incorporated. 9 **XXX is/is not** an organization within the meaning of the code.
- **5. Non-Duplication.** A grant cannot duplicate any services offered by the D.C. government. ¹⁰ The OANC was able to confirm with David Balik of DDOT that DDOT's maintenance of the trail only involves the Forestry Division trimming trees. The spreading of chips or anything else is not done by DDOT so there is no duplication of services with this grant.
- **6. Overhead.** Overhead cannot exceed 15% of the grant amount. None of the grant monies will be used for overhead as the Code defines it.

Conclusion

For the reasons stated above this grant is a **permissible/impermissible** expenditure of ANC funds.
